

Dear colleagues, dear students,

The French government has announced a change in the tuition fee system for incoming students from countries outside the European Union.

Our board of the University voted unanimously on December 7, 2018, asking the government to give up this measure.

Until now, no official regulatory text has been promulgated to formalize this announcement, but the new amounts are already announced on the Campus France website.

The information in my possession confirms that this measure should be put in place for the next academic year, with an exception for PhD students. The University will then be asked to apply the new regulatory text, regarding national diplomas.

I intend to propose to the University Board on March 15, 2019, not to increase registration fees for all incoming students from countries outside the European Union.

The request for exemption of students will be systematically accepted by the committee set up by the Department of Studies and Student Life (SEVES). The exact terms will be specified later.

The number of students we can exonerate is limited to 10% of all our registrants. As the governmental measure for the increase of fees only concerns the new registrations in a Bachelor or Master programme, we should remain below the ceiling of 10% of the enrollments, for the start of the academic year in September 2019.
